REP. MELVIN Laird, chairman of the House Republican Conference, has accused the Administration of a "shocking inconsistency" in awarding a lucrative Federal grant to a University of Pennsylvania professor who later engaged in a "teach-in" protesting American policy in South Viet Nam.

The professor, Philip E. Jacob, was awarded a \$545,000 grant last December to study "Community decision-making" in several countries, including Poland and Yugoslavia.

On April 7, Jacob took part in Philadelphia "teach-in" designed to protest American "aggression" in South Viet Nam.

Rep. Laird last month wrote to President Johnson bringing the matter to his attention.

"Those of us in Congress who attempt to give loyal support to a firm foreign policy in South-east Asia," he wrote, "are puzzled by the apparent ambivalence of our government exemplified in these incidents."

LAIRD RECEIVED a polite push-off from Presidential assistant Larry O'Brien, who said his letter would be "brought to the President's attention at the first possible opportunity." That was April 21 and the Wisconsin Republican has yet to hear anything further.
