

Mixed Orleans School May Again Close Doors

NEW ORLEANS (UPI) — A briefly desegregated Roman Catholic school appeared ready to close its doors for the third time today when neither white nor Negro students showed up for classes.

Eleven white students who attended classes at Our Lady of Good Harbor School No. 2 in Buras, La., Monday did not show up today by 9:30 a.m., an hour after the scheduled opening of school. However a priest and two nuns remained in the schools and the school doors remained open.

The five Negroes who desegregated the school August 29 again failed to appear. They have not shown up since that first day of school.

All appeared quiet in New Orleans today in the second week of Catholic school desegregation and third year of public school mixed classes.

Monday the boycotting eased and demonstrations quieted at most of the desegregated schools. Deputies told demonstrators at Westwego to disperse.

A rumored uprising at a mulatto school in Buras failed to materialize when no Negroes reported for classes Monday.

Bruno Funeral Service Will Be Wednesday

A native of Italy, Mr. Bruno served in the U. S. Army in World War I. He was a member of the American Legion, 40 & 8 Society, fourth degree member of the Knights of Columbus, member of the Lions Club, St. Matthews Catholic Church and the Catholic Credit Union.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Nellie Guerriero Bruno, 503 Roselawn Avenue; one daughter, Mrs. Sara Ellen Bottorff, Monroe; and four sisters, all in Trapani, Italy.
